In her work, Sipe aims to create a space of reconciliation and self-reflection in opposition to past resentment and shame.

Cary Esser's sculptures indulge the materiality of ceramics and draw on the history of architectural terra cotta, producing artworks ranging from single tiles to large-scale installations. She has served as chair of the Kansas City Art Institute (KCAI) ceramics department since 1996, receiving the school's Distinguished Achievement Award in 2013. She has been a resident artist at the Archie Bray Foundation, Watershed Center for the Ceramic Arts, the International Ceramics Studio in Hungary, and other venues.

Esser has exhibited widely, including at the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, Sherry Leedy Contemporary Art, Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art, and the Northern Clay Center. She holds an M.F.A. degree from New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University and a B.F.A. degree from KCAI. Esser was featured in the January 2024 Dutch ceramics journal *de kleine K* and the May 2024 issue of *IN Kansas City* magazine. She was recently awarded the title of Senior Professor at KCAI.



CELINA CURRY

Celina Curry is a multi-disciplinary painter based in Kansas City, Missouri. Originally from Allentown, Pennsylvania, she earned her B.F.A. from the Kansas City Art Institute in 2013. Curry's work combines traditional painting techniques with contemporary themes of neurodivergence, creating detailed, time-intensive pieces that invite deep engagement. Her paintings use familiar, traditional compositions to draw viewers into dream-like scenes from everyday life, where exaggerated forms and vivid colors evoke a sense of the uncanny. By blending nostalgia with the surreal, Curry's work challenges the fast-paced consumption of imagery, encouraging a more reflective and immersive viewing experience.

After completing his undergraduate studies, Youn traveled to Japan for the International Glass competition in Niijima Island and was awarded 1st place. Previously, Youn worked at the Toledo Museum of Art and has taught at Bowling Green State University as an adjunct professor.

Youn's work has received various scholarships and awards including from the Corning Museum of Glass, Pittsburgh Glass Center, Art Alliance for Contemporary Glass, Penland School of Craft, and Pilchuck Glass School. He is the 2023 SAXE Emerging Artist Award recipient from the Glass Art Society. His work has been exhibited broadly and internationally in Illinois, Missouri, Texas, California, Ohio, Michigan, Washington, Indiana, China, Italy, and Poland.

Every piece is thoughtfully designed with the belief that quality and intentional craftsmanship can create treasured, lasting objects.

Bolden tells stories of her dreams through miniature environments and quilt making. She brings the feeling of abandonment from her dreams into the world, allowing her to reimagine the atmosphere and emotions tied to them.

Wolf's sculptures transform everyday objects, such as stuffed animals, by covering them in cement, creating new forms that evoke both nostalgia and reflection. Her use of materials like clay, textiles, wood, and cement reflects a desire to challenge the viewer's perceptions and invite personal introspection. Wolf's process emphasizes the tension between soft and harsh materials, symbolizing the passage of time and the solidification of fleeting moments. Her work has been featured in the *Inspired by Maya Indigenous & Latino Art Experience* exhibition at Union Station and *Reflecting the City* at Charlotte Street Foundation. She was recently nominated for the International Sculpture Center's 2024 Outstanding Student Achievement in Contemporary Sculpture Award.

Throughout his life, Thomas Mueller has applied his versatile skills as a builder to large-scale woodworking projects, creating unique and functional pieces. His work stems from a desire to build exactly what he envisions, whether it's custom furniture or smaller pieces like jewelry boxes for his granddaughters, complete with resin inlays of their initials. Mueller's creativity extends beyond woodworking; he has sewn everything from a white three-piece suit to a Mickey Mouse costume, which remains a cherished memory. More recently, he has crafted custom clothing for his granddaughters, including dresses inspired by the 1965 film *The Sound of Music*. His first foray into miniatures was building a 1:12 scale model of his granddaughters' house, complete with detailed furnishings. While he humbly admires the precision of true miniature artists, Mueller's focus remains on capturing the essence of each project's unique setting.

Kansas native Traci Furan is a self-taught miniaturist whose work blends whimsy, nature, and folklore. With over 12-years as the creative force behind a successful infant apparel line sold across the United States, Furan's artistic journey has spanned multiple disciplines. Her career has included installing contemporary art for major museums worldwide.
